The Ultimate "Dip"

βάπτω (bapto) – To baptize (to dip, to wash, to dye) Βαπτίζω (baptizō) – I baptize (I dip, I wash, I dye)

Most Common Usages in the Bible

Dipping food (Example: John 13:6)

Dipping clothing in blood or dye (Example: Revelation 19:13)

Dipping a body into the water (Example: Matthew 3:6, Acts 1:5)

Immersing in the Holy Spirit (Example: Matthew 3:6, Acts 1:5)

Ceremonial washing (Luke 11:38)

Baptism: The outward display of leaving the old life and to now be of the "Flavor" of Christ

Matthew 5:13 (ESV) ¹³ "You are the salt of the earth, but if salt has lost its taste, how shall its saltiness be restored? It is no longer good for anything except to be thrown out and trampled under people's feet.

John 5:24-25 (NIV2011) ²⁴ "Very truly I tell you, whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life and will not be judged but has crossed over from death to life. ²⁵ Very truly I tell you, a time is coming and has now come when the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God and those who hear will live.

Romans 6:1-3 (HCSB) ¹ What should we say then? Should we continue in sin so that grace may multiply? ² Absolutely not! How can we who died to sin still live in it? ³ Or are you unaware that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death?

Romans 8:11 (ESV) 11 If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through his Spirit who dwells in you.
