- □ **Scenario** #3: You and your entire family have been kidnapped and sold into slavery in a foreign land and you are being worked and abused so severely that your lives won't last long.

THE RADICAL LOVE OF GOD:

Romans 5:6-8 (ESV) ⁶ For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. ⁷ For one will scarcely die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person one would dare even to die— ⁸ but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners. Christ died for us.

2 Corinthians 5:21 (NKJV) ²¹ For He made Him who knew no sin *to be* sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him.

We are inclined to help those who we respect and love, but to die for those who are our enemies can only be done with supernatural love... the love of God.

Let that truth sink in. God poured out His wrath on Jesus so that we could be seen as if we'd lived our lives perfectly, like Jesus!

John 6:28-29 (NASB) ²⁸ Therefore they said to Him, "What shall we do, so that we may work the works of God?"

²⁹ Jesus answered and said to them, "This is the work of God, that you believe in Him whom He has sent."
